So what is this joy the Lord?
The joy of the Lord is grounded in the of our salvation, a God of steadfast love and faithfulness ultimately revealed on the Cross!

When dependent upon our material circumstance or physical well-being joy will be elusive. But when grounded and rooted in Christ, joy is \_\_\_\_\_. Come to the Table of the Lord and celebrate this great salvation through Jesus Christ, and **know** the joy of the Lord!
