"O Love That Wilt Not Let Me Go"

For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.... John 3.16

I'm sure by now you have taken note of the three crosses on the front lawn of the Community Ministry Center with the message Love That Will Not Let Me Go! The title and the first line of the hymn from which it comes — O Love - are a fitting starting place to explore our relationship with God in Christ, for it is the love of God in Christ that is the beginning, the middle and the end of that relationship!

The love of Christ comes to us from the rich heritage of the Old Testament in which the saints celebrated God's love with the confession, O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His steadfast love endures forever! The Hebrew word hesed translated steadfast love does not have an English equivalent so scholars have come up with steadfast love. I like to use the word "stuckedness", which is not really a word, but conveys this idea of God's covenant commitment to His people. We can't get God to turn His back on us, even when we turn our backs on Him. An ancient Hebrew saint revealed that he got this when he wrote:

> When my soul was embittered, when I was pricked in heart,

I was stupid and ignorant; I was like a brute beast toward You.

Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold my right hand. Psalm 73.21.23

Regardless of his behavior he came to know that God continued to hold his right hand; God was "stuck" on him!

The fullness of God's *hesed* has finally been revealed in the birth, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ. If God's "stuckedness" was true for the Old Testament saints, how much more for those in Christ Jesus. The Apostle Paul wrote:

If God is for us who can be against us? He Who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things?

Romans 8:31-32


As we celebrate Palm Sunday, the events of Holy Week, and Easter Sunday, let's not forget what it all means: O love that will not let me go!

We are presently working the waiver process to get a sign of the size we want.

Camp Deborah Update

Camp Deborah is in Zambia Africa, and is outside the capital city of Lusaka. It started as merely a piece of land, purchased by the Women's Guild of the Presbyterian Church in Zambia. They had a dream and a vision of what the piece of land would become, and they are tirelessly working to that end. The first thing they did was have a bore hole drilled (a shallow well, basically a hollow pipe driven into the ground until it reached the water table). There is a hand pump at the top of the pipe, and it gives them a source of clean and safe water.

Next, they started a chicken-raising venture. They had a small building

built, with a chicken run outside the building. They bought baby chicks, raised them, and then sold them to a supermarket in the area. With their profits, they continue to buy, raise, sell and reinvest their profits.



They have recently planted a number of fruit trees, the beginnings of an orchard and farm that is part of the plan. They are currently starting a multi-purpose building, which will be used as a worship center and a conference center. They have erected the steel framework and are saving to buy roofing materials. They hire local unemployed men to help with the work and are thus already making an impact on their area.

Their ultimate goal is to also build a dormitory, to house students who will attend a school there. This is a very bold and faith-driven venture on the part of these women. We help support their work through a line item in our annual mission budget, and they are supporting our church through prayer - for God's

work that we are doing here.

Please pray for the Christ-driven work these women have undertaken at Camp Deborah, and that God will continue to guide and sustain them.
