



## “Consecration”

*I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.*

Romans 12.1

I had the privilege to spend the summer months “seeking the Kingdom of God.” During this sabbatical time there were two words that kept coming to mind: *consecration* and *accountability*.

The act of consecration is an Old Testament call by *Yahweh* or the leaders of Israel for the people “to separate them selves unto *Lord!*” One of these calls occurs after the 40 years in the wilderness; the people of God were about to cross the Jordan River and enter the Promised Land, and Joshua told them,

*‘Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do amazing things among you.’*

Joshua 3.5

Consecration is an intentional act revealing commitment to God! Apprenticeship to Christ cannot happen without intentional acts (spiritual disciplines) on the part of God’s people as we seek to follow Him! It is not new to Christ’s Community Church. Every Sunday, the worship assistant introduces the offering by first declaring God’s offering of His love in Christ:

*For God so loved the world He gave His only Son....*

After this, an elder and youth present gift of the bread and cup – representing the broken body and shed blood of Christ – and place them on the Communion Table, showing forth the depths of God’s love, the crucified Christ. This act of presentation is followed by an invitation to the congregation to respond to our Father’s great act of love by bringing our gifts to the Table, concluded with these words,

“...but even more than this, let us **present our bodies as living sacrifices**, holy and acceptable to God.”

The presentation of our gifts of money and our bodies are acts of **consecration**, that is, we set apart these gifts (our money and our bodies) as intentional acts to be used only for God’s purposes. The next Sunday you are in worship listen carefully to the invitation as we prepare for the offering. Think about what it means to “present (consecrate) our bodies as living sacrifices to God.” To offer our bodies as living sacrifices to God is the greatest gift we can give!


### Christmas Eve Candlelight Service



**Session Corner**



Session is currently reviewing the book "Walking with God" which is a collection of some of James S. Stewart's sermons. Ronald J. Allen (Christian Theological Seminary, IN) says about the sermons – [they] "...cause us to tremble at the majesty of God, move us to awe at the wonder of God's grace, evoke love for the Savior, and lay bare life's deepest issues in the context of the faithfulness of God"

I would like to share with you excerpts from Chapter 5: - "How to make our Prayers more real". Every now and then we worry about the effectiveness of our prayers (at least I do), or even go further by asking if we actually know how to pray. I hope this sermon will help allay some of our worries.

The chapter opens with Psalm 55:17 "Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud and He shall hear my voice." James Stewart then gives us seven (7) scripture-based "maxims" to making our prayers more real:

1. Pray Regularly: make time even if you are not in the mood, "keep your appointments with God".
2. Pray Continually: pray without ceasing, lift up your heart to God in all things.
3. Pray Concretely: be specific as to what you are praying about.
4. Pray Methodically: organize your prayer points.
5. Pray Affirmatively: positive affirmation is a vital form of prayer.
6. Pray Meditatively: walk in thought with Jesus, meditate on the attributes of God.
7. Pray Sincerely: empty your heart of sin (pages 44-48).

May this and other resources strengthen us on our journey to know Christ and make Him known.

The Elders meet in the Library for prayers every Sunday before worship. You are all invited to join us.





