Congratulations to Christ's Community Church and Rev. Bud Dryden for a sincere and blessed forty year partnership. Is this what the kids call a "mic drop"? There will have been ups and down and difficulties and backtracks, but Bud's retirement was like his ministry--planned carefully and lovingly without weird drama. Just "Wow!"

I first met the congregation and Bud in 1992, through my new seminary boyfriend, Omar Zambrana, your youth ministry intern. Omar did not necessarily indoctrinate the youth into the Christian faith but loved and enjoyed them very much. I was the intern at Yeadon Presbyterian Church and sometimes visited what was then Riverview Presbyterian Church worshipping in the big sanctuary. You were a welcoming congregation back then, too, and Bud was a kind and wise mentor to both Omar and me.

Christ's Community Church is that rare congregation that has been willing to grow and change with the times. You have died and been reborn, merged, changed names twice, committed and recommitted to a faithful and compassionate life together. The church has gone through intensive preparations for the transition of Bud's retirement and calling of a new minister. The session members, deacons and other leaders have pondered and prayed. The Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) is reviewing candidates for the position of Designated Pastor.

It is my privilege to be with you as a Transitional Minister until the Designated Pastor arrives. This could be several months to a year or more, but you can be sure that the leaders of the congregation will continue to communicate clearly and regularly as the process unfolds. God willing, you will know in a timely way when I will be leaving and when your Designated Pastor will arrive.

This is a time for the congregation to catch your breath, grieve the loss of your well-loved Pastor and thank God for all that has been. It is time to allow vourself to consider needs and opportunities that you have not addressed before. It is hard work, to stop between things and feel what you feel, think what you think, before plunging into something new. It is hard work to be open and respectful in relationships when the framework is shifting. I hope you will allow me to get to know you and learn what it is like for you during this time. I hope that you will let me know what it is you need and don't need.

The property team has been busy, even over the summer months, tackling a number of problems. We added lighting to the sign on the front lawn, which is now turned on by an optical sensor to minimize energy usage. We also fixed several interior electrical issues, most notably sockets in the Mouse and library. Further fixes have restored the light in the narthex, the drinking fountain and the AC units in the office area. New LED lighting was installed over the administrator's desk after the old fluorescent unit failed. Then, we were getting many false alarms from our fire detection system, prob-

ably from the extra heat and humidity. Several visits later and with the replacement of some portions of the system, we hopefully have fixed that issue. Finally, the sump pump in the sextant's closet died. The lumber is in-bound to replace that unit.

We have selected the vendors that will accompany us on our journey of caring for God's house. The painter will tentatively begin painting both entrances and all hallways on August 24.

The replacement windows for the office complex take about 5 weeks to receive. Once arrived they will be installed. After they are installed the painter will return and paint the 4 rooms in the office complex.

The Session dealt with 3 main areas of work this summer: increasing the role of Linda Evans, our administrator, hiring a new sextant, and hiring a bridge pastor.

First, after much debate and prayer, we asked Linda Evans to expand her duties and her time commitment to a full time position. We committed ourselves to providing her a full living wage, including benefits. While this goes beyond our budget, we are trusting in God to provide the extra income we will need to pay for the increased wages. Note that we have taken similar steps in faith in the past and each time, God has been faithful, providing cell tower lease revenues and unex-

pected bequests to meet our needs.


Secondly, we searched fruitlessly for a new sextant to replace Bob Kerr in the winter time. Our next attempt to hire someone was also looking poorly when God delivered a new candidate, Ignatius Oshiomogwe, out of the blue. Ignatius is between divinity degree programs at Princeton for this next year and was a great fit. We immediately made an offer and hired him, although he will only be with us for 1 year. Ignatius is from Nigeria and has great passion in connecting to people of Islamic faith as well as being a hard worker.

Finally, we have committed to a bridge pastor. Despite all our attempts to reduce the delays in the transition of pastors, we still found ourselves needing a pastor when Bud retires until we can hire a designated pastor. Let the hallelujahs resound! Again, God provided! Our long time friend and also a Presbyterian pastor, Mary Zambrana, had just become available. We quickly reached an agreement with her and she will be joining us starting on September 1. Mary will be a full time pastor, and will provide administrative duties and spiritual counseling as well as preaching to us. We are truly a blessed congregation!




"We are Named"

A miracle! An Ignatius miracle! The personnel team has also been seeking to employ a sexton for the church following the retirement of Bob Kerr who served faithfully for at least twenty years. Ignatius is currently working toward a doctorate at Princeton. His passion is to work with refugees. A native of Nigeria, Ignatius is married with two children living in his native home. He has offered to care for the facility during as a place where God dwells.

The Wilderness is Not a Desolate Place

Joshua 22:5 – "Take good care to observe the commandment and instruction that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded you, to love the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to keep his commandments, and to **hold fast** to him, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul."

Let us remember that we find our identity, "in Christ" alone and that identity supersedes everything and everyone.

Let us remember the faith and good work of God's servant, Bud, with tears of sadness and tears of joy for what he has done and look forward in hope as we carry into the world the knowledge of what we hold in our hearts as he taught us in Christ.
