Introduction

How wide a range of thought, belief, speech and practice do you expect within a Christian congregation in general, and this congregation specifically? *Example: Food*

1. The event of the Passover

God promised Abraham that his descendants would inherit the land of Canaan. Under Abraham's great-grandson, Joseph, the family relocated to Egypt to survive a famine, but after several generations became slaves there, likely when the ruling dynasty changed. Today's text is the story of the night before Moses leads his fellow Israelites out of Egypt to head back to Canaan, the Promised Land.

- The enduring celebration of the Passover night
 Ever since that night, every year the Jewish community in every place remembers it.
 - a. In the household
 - b. With words in the language the household uses
 - c. With a script that follows the Scriptural tradition and is fitted to the situation and concerns of the household. The Haggadah.
- 3. Christian experience of the Exodus
 - a. PC(USA) does not engage in evangelism to Jewish people
 - b. The Lord's Table as an extension of the Passover Meal Jesus shared with his disciples the night before he was crucified. Christ as the Passover Lamb.
 - c. Centered in the sanctuary or communal worship of the Christian Community.
